ROUGH PLAY - FLAGRANT FOULS - TECHNICAL FOULS

All coaches and club directors are hereby informed that officials have been instructed to call all AAU licensed girls basketball games according to high school rules and style of play. In addition, officials have been instructed to assess flagrant 1 or 2 fouls when the physicality/player action of the foul(s) warrants. The perception and reputation of AAU basketball being rough and out of control will no longer exist. Please be assured that Minnesota AAU's number one priority is player safety. Our second priority is to provide competition that is fair and sportsmanlike, and not influenced by physical intimidation.
